WHO TO INFORM



This checklist highlights some of the organisations and companies who should be informed when someone dies. They range from government and financial organisations to utilities and household contacts. You can use the checklist to keep track of who you have notified and their contact details.

ADVISE THE GOVERNMENT

If you can't access the government's Tell Us Once service, or if you live in Northern Ireland, you will need to notify the following government organisations separately.
